ROTARY CLUB OF WILMINGTON, DELAWARE SCHOLARSHIP

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Rotary Club of Wilmington, Delaware offers trade school programs, two, and four-year scholarships of up to \$3,500 per year. These scholarships are awarded to students who are about to enter their freshman year of post- secondary education (including trade school, community college, and college) and will be renewed automatically if the student fulfills his or her academic requirements. No student will be funded for more than four years.

It is Rotary's goal to support individuals who will become civic leaders in their field and community, reflecting **Rotary International's Four Way Test:**

Of the things we think, say or do:

- Is it the truth?
- Is it fair to all concerned?
- Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

In order to be considered for an award beginning in the Fall of this coming academic year, applicants must submit a completed application, including all required attachments to the Rotary Club of Wilmington by **Monday, April 20, 2020 at 5:00pm**

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for consideration, the applicant *must be*:

- a citizen of the United States and resident of New Castle County; with preference given to students residing in the City of Wilmington;
- a high school senior attending a public or private school in New Castle County, or being home-schooled in New Castle County;
- formally admitted and committed to a public or private school of higher education for the upcoming academic year, including trade schools. It is *not* required that the school be located in Delaware or be a 2 or 4-year program.

****Children of Rotary Club of Wilmington members are not eligible to apply.**

SELECTION CRITERIA

In selecting award winners, the Scholarship Committee will consider the following factors:

- service to the community over and above requirements for school credit, including volunteerism, caregiving and/or employment.
- financial need based on family income and on the financial aid package provided by the school;
- participation and leadership roles in extracurricular activities;
- academic achievement in the form of high school grades, SAT scores, honors and awards, and other evidence of scholarly excellence;

PROCEDURES OF THE COMMITTEE

The committee members will assess the completed applications in accordance with the criteria listed above.

Up to 10 finalists will be invited for in-person interviews with the committee between 5:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on **Wednesday, May 27 or Thursday, May 28, 2020.**

Following the interviews, award winners will be selected.

When the process is complete, award winners will be notified by telephone and mail that they have been awarded a scholarship. These letters should arrive on or **before June 8, 2020.**

In addition to the completed application form, the following attachments must be submitted by the due date:

- a transcript of the applicant's academic record;
- a copy of the applicant's SAT scores;
- at least one letter of recommendation from a teacher or other school official that includes an evaluation of the applicant's potential for leadership and scholastic achievements
- an essay or link to video essay based on the Rotary Four Way Test
- the Student Aid Report (SAR) that is produced after completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA);
- the letter provided by the financial officer of the admitting college or university detailing the financial package being offered to the applicant;
- (OPTIONAL) statement written by a mentor, parent, guardian or an adult that has that is familiar with that applicant and would like to share what the committee should consider

If you do not have any information for a required field, type "NA." You may type your name in the signature line and email the application without printing **OR** you can print, sign, scan and email.
